Downtown Bike Lanes

(see map) Protected bike lanes on Penn Avenue from the 16th Street Bridge to Stanwix Street, 6th Street from Penn Avenue to Fort Duquesne Blvd., and across Clemente Bridge.

Healthy Ride Pittsburgh is a public bike sharing system, operated by Pittsburgh Bike Share with numerous bike stations in Downtown. The bikes are available to rent 24/7, 365 days a year.

Three Rivers Heritage Trail

A multi-use, 24-mile riverfront trail system, has segments on both banks of Pittsburgh's three rivers that provide access to city neighborhoods, business districts, and local attractions. The trail highlights Pittsburgh's history through Interpretive Signage. It also serves as the Pittsburgh hub for such other trail system connections as the Great Allegheny Passage, the Erie-to-Pittsburgh Trail, and the Pittsburgh-to-Harrisburg Main Line Canal Greenway. THE LIBERTY BRIDGE CORRIDOR

The Liberty Bridge Project

Continues through 2017 with a scheduled completion date of July 2018. There will be weekend and overnight closures. In addition, the Blvd of the Allies ramp to Liberty Bridge will be closed for 80 days, and Ramps A (from Liberty Bridge to Blvd of the Allies) & B (from Blvd to the Bridge) will be closed from April for 132 days. 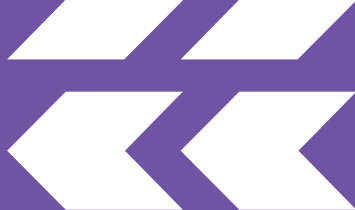
The Liberty Tunnel Phase 5 project

Begins in spring of 2017 with an estimated completion date of spring 2019. There will be weekend and overnight scheduled closures. Nightly outbound tunnel closures will use McArdle Roadway as the detour. McArdle Roadway will not be used as the detour for weekend closures of the bridge and tunnel.

PennDOT will try to ensure that scheduled closures of the Liberty Bridge and the Liberty Tunnels are coordinated to occur at the same time.

The Liberty Interchange Project

Involves replacing the bridge decks over the interchange. Running from March - July 2017 this project requires 31 nights of restrictions on Rte. 51, followed in mid-April by long-term restrictions on northbound Rte. 51.

Check out the T Free Fare zone including all T stations from First Avenue to Allegheny Station on the North Side. It's free 24/7.

Remember: pay when you enter all Port Authority buses and the T. All fares are \$2.50 with a ConnectCard; \$2.75 with cash. Transfers are \$1 with ConnectCard; full fare required if using cash. Children up to age 5 ride free with fare-paying adult.

All Port Authority bus routes are equipped with bike racks. Bikes can also be brought aboard the T or Mon Incline.

DRIVING TO DOWNTOWN PITTSBURGH

North (I-279)

FROM I-279: Take Exit 1A (Ft. Duquesne Blvd. / Convention Center / Strip District) to Ft. Duquesne Blvd.

TO I-279: Take Seventh Ave. to Veterans Bridge (I-579) OR take Stanwix Street at Ft. Pitt Blvd. or Ft. Duquesne Blvd. to Ft. Duquesne Bridge

Northeast(ROUTE 28)

FROM ROUTE 28: Take South I-579 (Veterans Bridge/Monroeville) to Sixth or Seventh Avenue exits

TO ROUTE 28: Take Seventh Ave. to Veterans Bridge (I-579) OR take 6th, 7th or 9th St. Bridges to East General Robinson Street

Northwest (ROUTE 65)

FROM ROUTE 65: Exit to Ft. Duquesne Bridge / Take Exit 1A (Ft. Duquesne Blvd. / Convention Center / Strip District) to Ft. Duquesne Blvd.

TO ROUTE 65: Take Stanwix St. at either Ft. Pitt Blvd. or Ft. Duquesne Blvd. to Ft. Duquesne Bridge OR take 6th, 7th or 9th St. Bridges to Lacock St.

South and West (I-376 AND ROUTE 51) and Pittsburgh International Airport

FROM I-376: Through the Ft. Pitt Bridge / Tunnel

FROM ROUTE 51: Take Liberty Bridge / Use Sixth or Seventh Ave. exit

TO I-376: Take outbound Ft. Pitt Bridge / Tunnel to (I-376 West)

TO ROUTE 51: Take Seventh Ave. to South I-579 (Monroeville/Liberty Bridge) to the Liberty Bridge OR Blvd. of the Allies to Liberty Bridge **TO AIRPORT:** Take outbound Ft. Pitt Bridge / Tunnel (I-376 West)

East (I-376) and PA Turnpike (I-76)

FROM I-376/I-76: Use Exits 72B (Blvd. of the Allies / Liberty Bridge), 71B (Second Ave.), 71A (Grant St.) or 70D (Stanwix St.)

TO I-376/I-76: Take Grant St. on-ramp OR eastbound Blvd. of the Allies to eastbound I-376 OR Seventh Ave. to South I-579 (Monroeville/Liberty Bridge) to Monroeville follow eastbound I-376 to Exit 85 (PA Turnpike Ohio/Harrisburg)

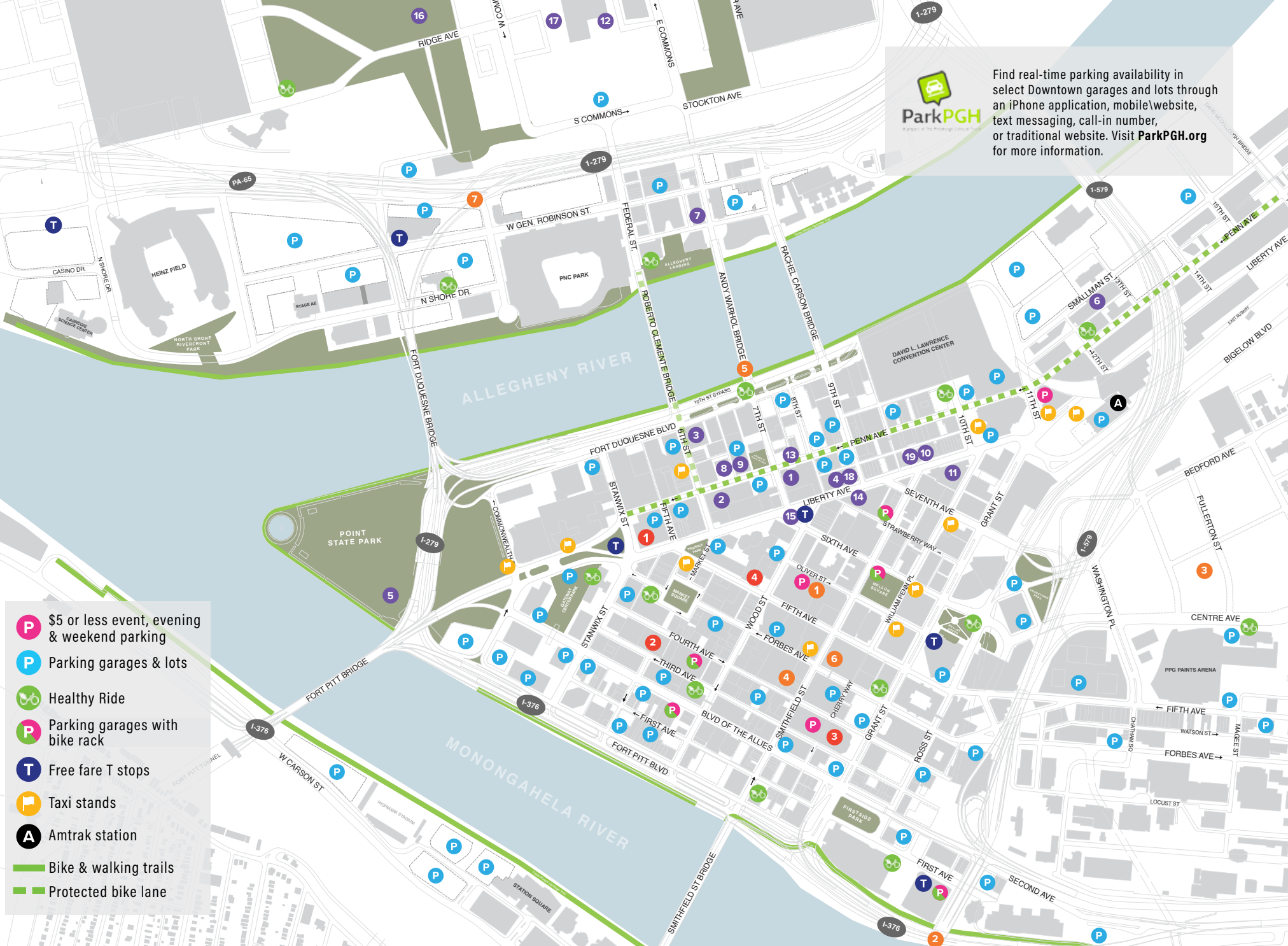
