
DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES MEETING

The **Pittsburgh Wayfinding Project** intends to establish a pedestrian wayfinding system around major pedestrian corridors and key landmarks to support Pittsburgh's unique geography, the city's transportation infrastructure, and the communities of Oakland, Downtown, the North Shore, and the North Side. The main goals of the pedestrian wayfinding system are "to convey an image or identity for each neighborhood, be multimodal for all users, welcome visitors, encourage adventure, provide guidance, be scalable, and integrate universal design principles that can be replicated across the city."

Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership will be presenting on the Wayfinding Project to the Downtown and Oakland communities in this Development Activities Meeting. The project will then be reviewed by the Art Commission and Historic Review Commission.

What is a Registered Community Organization?

Oakland Planning and Development Corporation (OPDC), the **Oakland Business Improvement District (OBID)**, and **Oakcliffe Community Organization (OCO)** are Registered Community Organizations (RCOs) serving the Oakland neighborhood. **Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership** is the RCO for Downtown Pittsburgh. Being RCOs gives these organizations a formal role with the City of Pittsburgh in the review of development activities and the coordination of neighborhood planning processes, including Development Activities Meetings.

What is a Development Activities Meeting?

A Development Activities Meeting (DAM) provides an opportunity for citizens, property owners, business owners, and other stakeholders to learn about development proposals that affect them and to resolve concerns with proposed development teams during the development application process. DAMs must be held at least 30 days prior to an applicant's first public hearing at the Planning Commission, Zoning Board of Adjustment, Art Commission, or Historic Review Commission.
