Overview:

The Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership (PDP) has been awarded funds from the Urban Redevelopment Authority's (URA) Outdoor Dining Grant Program to construct an outdoor dining area. This program provides grant funding towards outdoor dining area installations that enable restaurant seating and service to occur safely outdoors. The PDP is seeking the services of a contractor to provide materials and labor (at State prevailing wage rates, as required by the American Rescue Plan Act source of funds) to fully implement this one block section of outdoor dining within Downtown Pittsburgh's Cultural District. This seasonal patio installation will be critical to the placemaking and business development goals of the PDP, on behalf of, and with the engagement of, the restaurants on this block. Scope of Work and Objectives:

The scope of work includes sourcing materials and installing outdoor dining amenities that span one block on one side of Penn Ave in Downtown Pittsburgh. The intent of the new amenities is protection from and resilience to vehicular damage.

1) On-Street Barriers

a. Item: Large Planters

 Purpose: To provide an enclosed, safe outdoor dining area and prevent dangerous motor vehicle encroachment (as recommended and approved by City of Pittsburgh's Dept of Mobility & Infrastructure (DOMI))

c. Quantity: 28



2) On-Curb Barriers

- a. Item: Bollard and chain system
- Purpose: To provide an enclosed, safe outdoor dining area, separating it from roadway activity (as recommended and approved by DOMI)
- c. Quantity: 51 Bollards, 510 feet of Chain



3) Roadway-Bike Lane Buffers

- a. Item: Concrete curb stops
- b. Purpose: To prevent illegal parking and dangerous motor vehicle encroachment onto the outdoor dining area (as recommended and approved by DOMI)
- c. Quantity: 39
